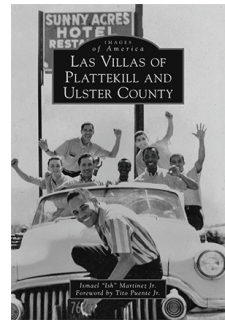

Museum Passes

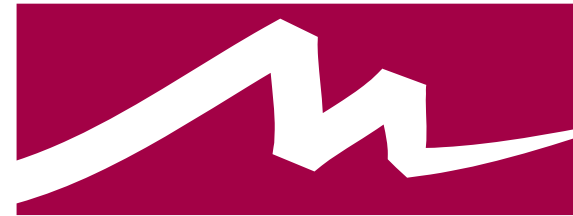

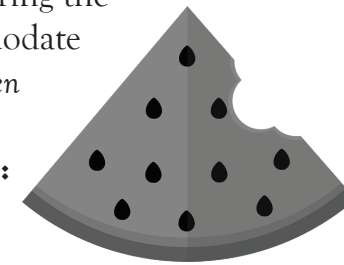

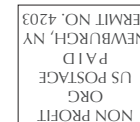
